We are looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise of Mooroolbark East Primary School's voluntary financial contributions for 2024.

Mooroolbark East Primary School provides students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and offers programs which nurture the interests, health and wellbeing of all children at our school. The ongoing support of families ensures we can continue to offer the best possible educational opportunities, in line with our commitment to ensuring individual student needs are met on an academic, social and emotional level.

We would like to thank you for all your support, whether that is through fundraising or volunteering your time. All of these contributions to Mooroolbark East Primary School have enabled us to:

- Employ a nurse to oversee and manage first aid/sick bay.
- Ensure class sizes remain low, with an average class size of just 21.4 students per grade in 2023.
- Ensure playgrounds and school facilities are upgraded and maintained to support the needs of our 600+ student population.
- Provide enhanced digital learning opportunities via platforms such as Seesaw and Essential Assessment, as well as structured technology sessions with an expert practitioner.
- Offer a wide and holistic specialist learning program, including Art, Physical Education, Mandarin (LOTE), Music (Performing Arts) and Digital Technologies.
- Ensure a safe and secure learning environment, including, but not limited to, regular OHS and Child Safety audits, as well as more than 25 Close Circuit TV cameras around the school.
- Expand our community wellbeing team which includes our own School Psychologist.
- Expand, upgrade and maintain wellbeing spaces including our "Treehouse", withdrawal areas and open learning spaces.
- Continue to provide Mooroolbark East Primary School students with a vast array of experiences including camps, excursions, incursions and tours.

With your ongoing support, our school is committed to ensuring the continuity of the items listed above, whilst also remaining committed to providing more opportunities for your children in 2024 and beyond.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
